WHAT CAN I LEARN?

Not only will he/she increase his/her fluency by learning words in chunks called collocations but the student will also learn how to talk about actions that began in the past and continue until now, and even actions that have happened one or more times in the past using the Present Perfect Tense. The student will be able to put together pieces of information and decide for himself/herself what is likely to be true based on the information at hand as well. More practice will eventually develop the student's capability to deduce and to think critically. During presentations, the student can confidently check if the listeners understand him/her especially when he/she is explaining something or giving a presentation. Finally, the student will learn more about Christmas celebration in different countries as well as terminologies related to the aforementioned occasion.
